



Instructional Guidelines

Religious formation of the child takes place in the home, in church and in the class setting. Students will be tested regularly, both orally and written. Generally, the testing is very simple and brief and based on the weekly class lessons. If a child has difficulty with written tests, the Catechist will arrange for an oral test to be given.

Students who do not satisfactorily complete the course of study at each grade level or do not attend the required number of classes may be required to repeat the grade. **Absences from more than 4 classes may result in a student repeating the grade.** This is at the discretion of the Director of Religious Education.

The student must make up the work of missed classes.



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Each student receives Religious Education text materials. If a textbook is lost, stolen, or damaged, a new one must be purchased.

Student Behavior

An important part of Religious Education is to lead children to put the Catholic values of peace and justice into practice. Students will be held responsible for their conduct.

Therefore:

1. Self respect and respect of others is expected. Disrespect, prejudice, violence of speech or action is not tolerated.
2. Any child causing damage to parish property will be required to pay for repairs and /or replacement.

General Guidelines

Attendance/tardiness-Your child's regular attendance is very important. The Archdiocese of Detroit has strict guidelines concerning attendance. Religious Education classes should take priority over other programs and activities. Please call the office on the day of any absence. Absences from 4 classes may result in a student repeating the grade. Please have your children to class on time. Tardiness is a problem for safety and class participation. Excessive tardiness will accumulate into absences.

Behavior warning-When a student consistently fails to follow the safety and classroom rules, a notice will be mailed to parents. The second warning will require a parent to attend class with the student.

Communications-Please pay attention to all notes that are sent home from the teacher



or the Religious Education office. In addition, important information about the program is noted in the church bulletin.

Security-All school doors are locked, only the main school entrance door is used for religious education classes. Main school entrance door is locked during class time. Door will be monitored for late arrivals and will not be unlocked until dismissal at 7:00 pm.

Arrival-Follow arrows in parking lot and drop off students at entrance to school building. Students in grades Kindergarten through second grade may be walked to classroom.

Dismissal-Students in grades kindergarten through second grade must have a parent or older sibling escort them at end of class. All children should be picked up from the parking lot adjacent to the school building. Please be on time to pick up your child and be cautious with your arrivals and departures. The children's safety is vital.

Student needs-At time of Registration, please note important home, dietary or education needs of your child.

Supervision of students-All students are supervised when they are in the building. There is to be no "hanging around" before/after classes. Non-students or non-authorized adults are not permitted on the grounds or in the building during class sessions.

Covid 19 safety protocol-safety guidelines concerning Covid 19 will be shared in a separate document and updated as needed.

On-going communication is essential for the Religious Education Program to effectively serve the youth of Saint Charles Parish. Do not hesitate to call with any questions, concerns, suggestions, or volunteer offer.
